
Buckingham Palace

As we reach the end of the Autumn term I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on the work and some special moments we have shared in the library...

 It was so lovely to see our Reception children introduced to the library. We shared some of the best stories together and I was impressed with how eagerly they joined in with the dramatic reading of The Gruffalo.



- For Year 1 it was the first time they were able to borrow books for home reading and I was glad to see the majority of children well prepared for their library sessions.
- Year 2 children have been using the library with growing confidence and they were getting
 into their first chapter books. That's about the age when they discover humorous aspect of
 stories and they do love to indulge in the misadventures of Horrid Henry or Jeremy Strong's
 mischievous characters.
- Non-fiction books were definitely a preferred choice for many children in Year 3 as they learnt to explore the library resources in more depth. Having explored the features of the fantasy fiction books we embarked on reading 'The Day I Fell Into a Fairytale' by Ben Miller and even though we haven't finished the book yet, children seemed to enjoy every minute of it.
- Year 4 went on a little time travel journey and ended up in the year 3020 with the characters from 'Future Friend', an adventure story dealing with the issues of climate change and a dystopian future. We loved discussing and predicting the events in the story and I was very moved to hear how passionate they were about the state of our planet.
- For Year 5 it was a term of some excellent, thoughtful reading choices as well as some light-hearted fun. We all laughed out loud following the rivalry of two siblings, Zack and Luke in the comic tale 'My Brother is a Superhero' by David Solomons.
- 'The Boy Who Made Everyone Laugh' by Helen Rutter was my personal choice to share with children in Year 6. A powerful story of 11 year old by with a stammer who dreams of becoming a stand-up comedian warmed our hearts from the first pages.

Sharing stories with children is always the highlight of my day in the library. It's wonderful to see empathy, kindness and understanding come to life. It's incredible how much joy story reading brings to a person; do remember to get involved with your child's reading at home and share a love of stories.
