
1ST will have their Parents' Evening on Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd March.

Earth



Year 5


Kingswood Visit

School Height and Weight Measurements

As part of the National Child Measurement Programme, we have arranged to undertake measurements for **Reception and Year 6 on Thursday 23rd March at 9.15am.**

About the National Child Measurement Programme

Each year in England, school children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight checked at school as part of the National Child Measurement Programme. Height and weight measurements are used to calculate weight status. We collect this information because it is in the public interest to understand how many children are overweight, healthy weight or underweight. Your child's class will take part in this year's programme.

The checks are carried out by trained member of school nursing team. Children are measured fully clothed, except for their coats and shoes, in a private space away from other pupils.

The wellbeing of children and families is very important. Measurements are conducted in a sensitive way, in private and away from other children. Individual results are not shared with your child or their school. The weight and height information is shared only with you in the parent or carer feedback letter. It is your choice if you share the information with your child. If you are concerned about your child's growth, weight, body image or eating patterns, seek further support from a school nurse or General Practitioner.

If you are happy for your child to be measured, you do not need to do anything. If you do not want your child's height and weight to be checked, or your child has a medical condition that affects their height or weight please let the school know so that they can advise the school nurse who will be carrying out the measurements. Children will not be made to take part on the day if they do not want to.
