

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Clarity on the management of industrial action

A number of parents have asked me why we cannot mix the classes up so the same children are not affected every time by strike action. Whilst I appreciate this must be intensely frustrating for some families, the issue for me is that I am simply not allowed to cover the work of striking teacher. Other staff can legally refuse to cover the work of a striking colleagues so it was impossible for me to mix or change the classes around.

There are two or three different teaching unions and this series of strikes was just the NEU (National Education Union). We have approximately 10 members of this union and other staff are in other unions not taking strike action. Therefore, if your child's class teacher is part of the NEU then they have been liable to be affected.

I hope this clarifies why I could not have managed this in any other way.

Mother's Day Cards


In Nursery this week, we have been creating Mother's Day cards using our hand prints and finger prints. We are personalising the cards with special messages to our female relatives.
